

SAT vs ACT:

The Two Tests Compared

SAT

ACT

Sections:

Reading (65 mins) Writing and Language (35 mins) Math Calculator (55 mins) Math No Calculator (25 mins) Essay (55 mins)

English (45 mins) Math (60 mins) Reading (35 mins) Science (35 mins) Essay (40 mins)

Total time:

3 hours (without Essay) 3 hours 55 minutes (with Essay) 2 hours 55 minutes (without Essay) 3 hours 35 minutes (with Essay)

Scoring:

The Reading/Writing section and Math section each have a total score of 800. Together they make up a combined total of 1600.

Each section of the ACT uses a score between 1 and 36. A student's total score is the average of their four section scores.

Cost:

\$47.50 (without Essay) \$64.50 (with Essay)

\$49.50 (without Essay) \$51 (for international students) \$58.50 (with Essay)

Calculator Policy:

Calculator not allowed in one section of the test.

Students allowed to use a calculator on all portions of the test.
